Thank you also for being a part of the TNC Umpires Group, your contribution to our competitions is great, and I look forward to seeing some of you advance to your next qualification in the next few years.

To the umpires who were successfully awarded your Centre Practical Award. Well done for refining your umpiring skills and stepping up the pathway to become a qualified Centre Umpires. All up we now have 35 new Centre Umpires joining the TNC Umpires Group and it was awesome to see the development. For some of you from previous seasons, and others over this current season, your hard work has paid off for you. Thanks also for giving up your time to umpire some of the games in our competitions, your newfound skills were very much appreciated. Congratulations to our new Centre Umpires for establishing your umpire skills on the "Umpires pathway", I hope you keep on going to reach the next step on your journey.

Our Zone umpires grew by a few this season, 4 new Zone Award Umpires have ascended to their next Award qualification in our group by successfully achieving their Zone Practical, and 2 of our umpires were also successful in being re-endorsed for their Zone Award. Congratulations to all of you, for accomplishing your goal to become a Zone Umpire, and well done stepping up to umpire in our Premier Open Competition. It was great to see your confidence grow with your newfound skills in the competition, and I look forward to seeing you continuing your Umpire Journey to higher qualifications at our Centre.

Consolidation was the key for our NZ Award Umpires this season. Our 2 new umpires from last year, Keni and Gemma, continued to grow their skills, both were selected to umpire at the NNZ Under 18 and Men's Under 17 tournament. I was so proud to see when they got back the growth that they had made, they grew in stature as

umpires right before my eyes. Connor, one of our NNZ B umpires, was selected to umpire at the NNZ Open tournament way down south, and he came back buzzing from the experience. You could see he had also added some new skills to his "Umpire Toolkit". Connor and Gemma also were selected to umpire at the NNZ Secondary Schools tournament, which was an awesome experience to top their season off with. Well done to all our NZ Umpires who umpired for our Premier Open competition. The success of having this level of games at our Centre is helped immensely by having your amazing skills officiating these games.

We have had a number of Theory successes this season, 34 new Centre Theory passes (some who have gone on to gain their Centre Practical (as mentioned above), 8 new Zone theory passes, who are working toward their Zone Practical to complete their NNZ Zone Award. Also 3 new NZ Theory passes, they also are working hard to their complete the fitness requirement and be successful in achieving their NZ Practical to be a NZ C Award Umpire. Congratulations to you all for your hard work and studying of the rulebook which has led you to successfully pass your theory exams this season.

It was awesome to see our Netball Clubs put forward some of their members to learn to umpire and become their team umpires for the games in our Senior Competition. By the end of their season most had completed their umpire coaching and were successfully presented their Centre Award. We are still needing more of our clubs to recognise the importance of developing umpires who can represent their Netball Club and encourage the progression of Umpires for their/our Netball Centre to continue to be able offer the type of competitions that their clubs can partake in and enjoy.
